Impact., the awards program provides institutional recognition in four categories: Student, Faculty, Community Partner, and Institutional Leadership. All two- and four-year public and private higher education institutions are eligible and are invited to submit nominations. Institutional award recipients will receive a cash award, certificate, two registration fee waivers for the 2018 ESC Annual Conference, and will be invited to participate in an Excellence Awards Recipients Panel Presentation during the 2018 conference.

ESC Board President Samory T. Pruitt, vice president for community affairs at The University of Alabama, underscored the importance of the highly competitive program. "These awards recognize the best engagement scholarship has to offer. Each year we know these submissions will include many innovative and practical solutions to some of the most critical problems facing our nation and world today," Pruitt said.

The ESC Excellence Awards Program recognizes activities that improve the quality of life for individuals, families, and communities, while building capacity through community engagement scholarship. The program also provides important recognition opportunities for students, faculty, community partners, and higher education institutions and increases opportunities for enhanced peer learning.

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
