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Project Background



- Older adults and their family members do not know where to turn when a crisis arises:
 - What barriers exist?
- Most people **do not plan ahead** for aging.
 - What behaviors drive resource seeking?
- Many aging-related community services are available but residents *need help finding them*.
 - What can we learn from testing local interventions?










Continuum of Community Engagement

Community Expert Input: Barriers to Resource Access

Personal Factors

- Not knowing/admitting there is a need
- Not wanting to lose independence
- Not being aware that there *are* resources
- Not familiar with technology
- Lack of planning ahead

• Family Factors


- Family out of town, unavailable, unfamiliar with local resources
- System Factors
 - System is confusing, overwhelming
 - Language/cultural barriers







Senior Access Points Outreach



Between Jan. 2018 – Sep. 2019:

- ✓ 19,384 SAP cards & magnets distributed
- ✓ 66 presentations given
- ✓ to 1,436 attendees
- ✓ 58 medical outpatient sites equipped to provide outreach materials
- ✓ 26 Ambassador Volunteers trained
- ✓ 312 New website visitors per month
 - 213 New calls to the Office on Aging



Continuum of Community Engagement






