Individual, Family, & Community Wellbeing Planning & Reporting Unit (PRU)

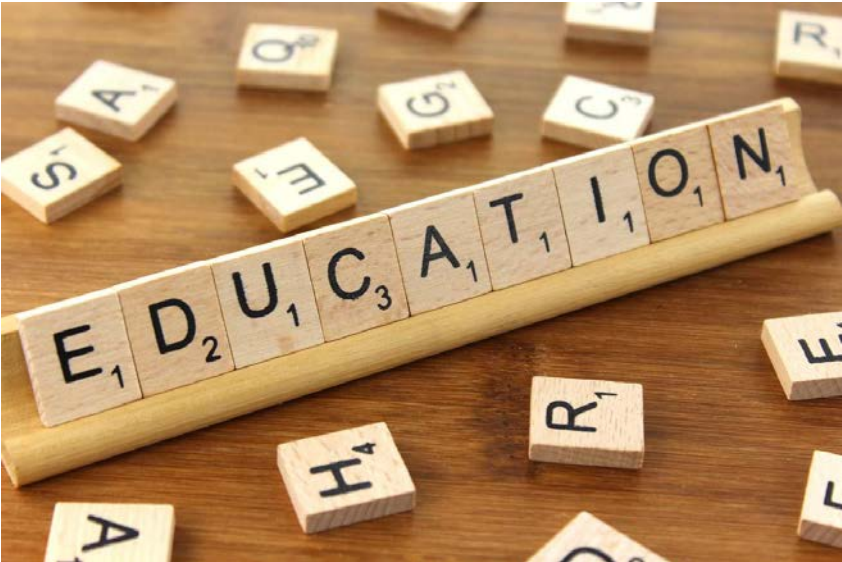


SPECIALIST-ONLY MODEL VS. PROJECT-BASED ENGAGEMENT MODEL

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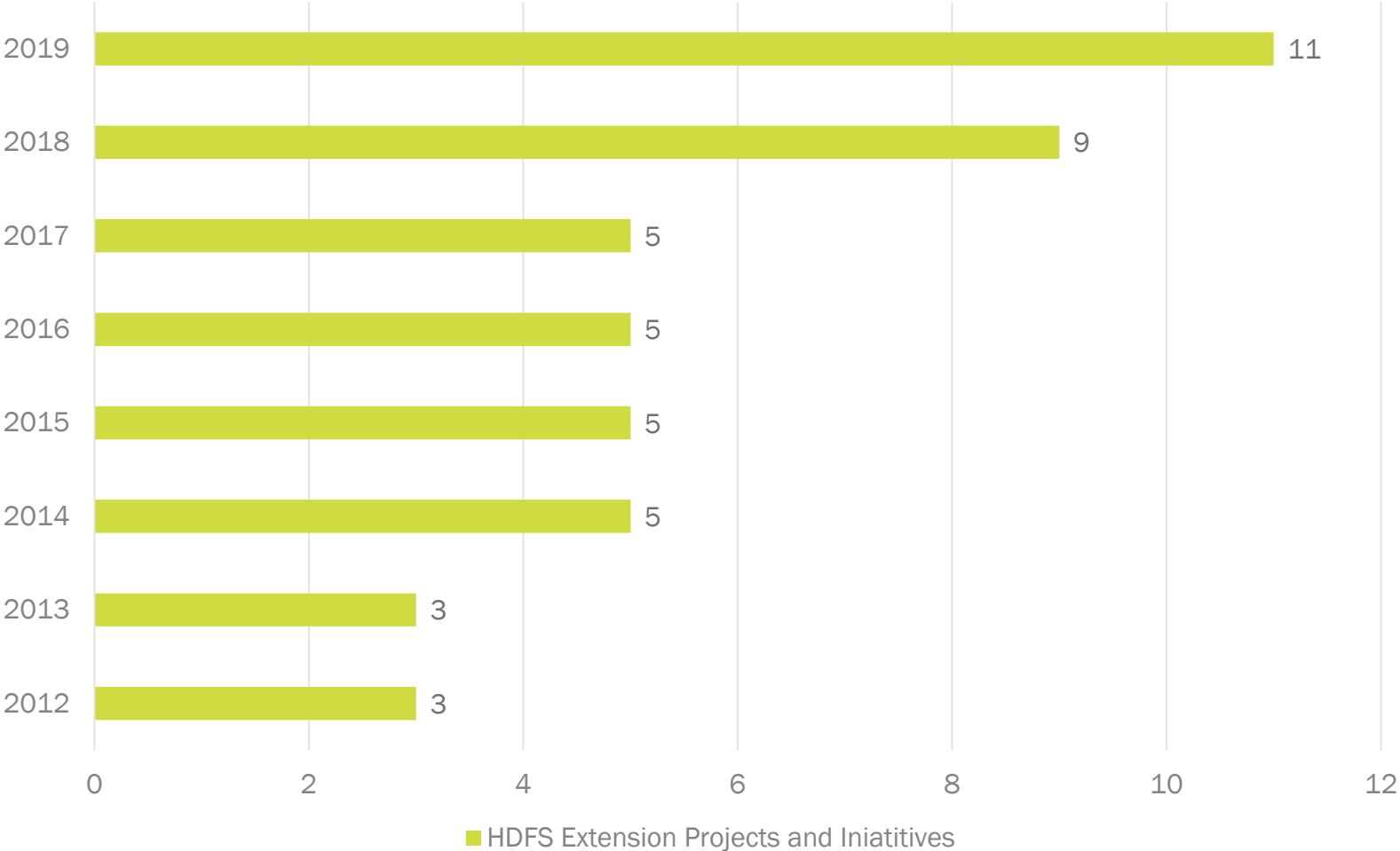
Specialist-Only Model	Project-Based Engagement
Single faculty member or % FTE of faculty members	Multiple and varying faculty members
(Often) limited topics addressed, based on single expertise and knowledge	Multiple topics addressed, breadth and depth of faculty expertise
(Perhaps) static	Flexible – responding to national, state and county and/or community needs
(Could be) burdensome for one person	Utilizes coordination
Limited graduate student engagement	Varying graduate student assistant support/theses

ROLE OF HDFS DIRECTOR OF EXTENSION PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES

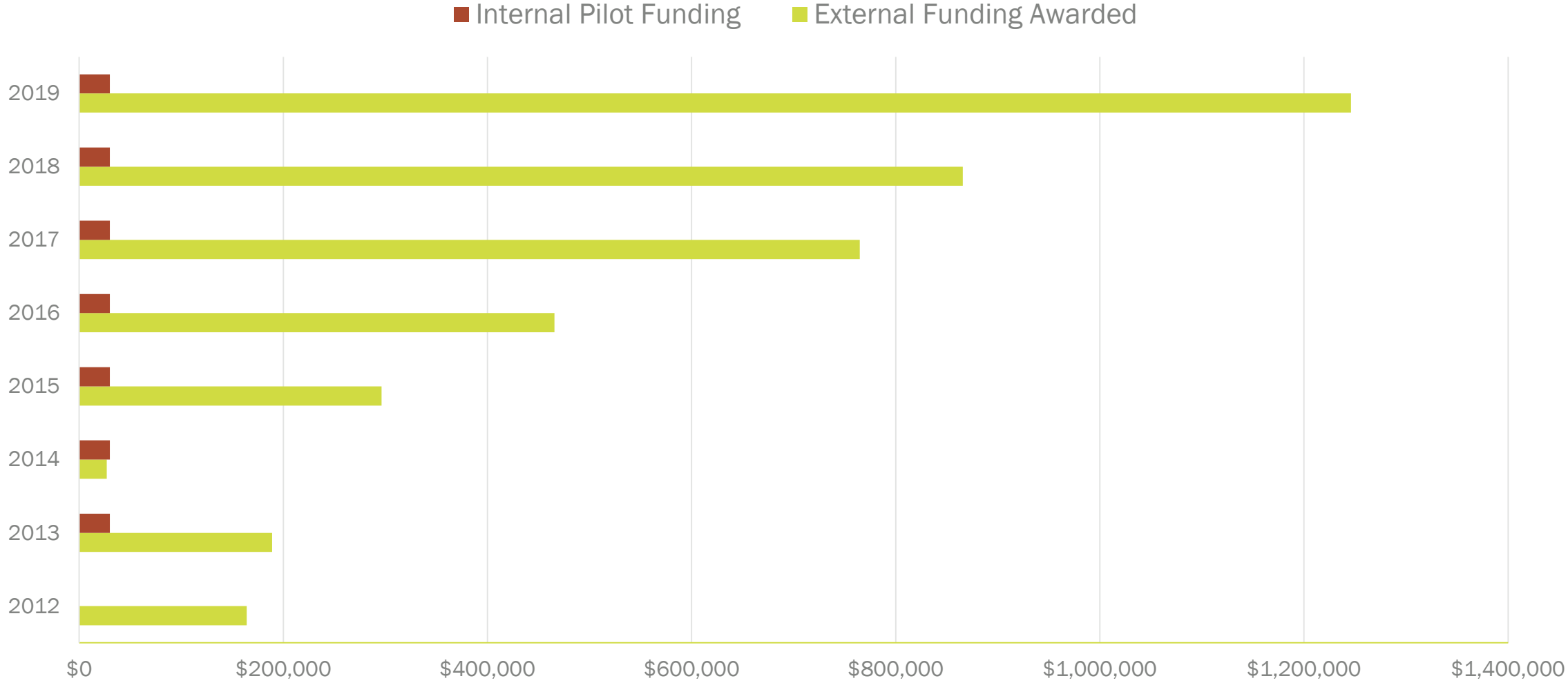
