Why Do We Need Campus Dialogues?

National polarization between different political perspectives has been growing for the past 25 years

Protesting on college campuses is at a record high since the 1960s

 Higher Education Institute Survey found over 25% of students participated in a protest, rally, or boycott in 2017, the highest level since 1967



Why Do We Need Campus Dialogues?

Students' support of First Amendment rights is growing more complicated...

- 60% of students either don't think the First Amendment protects hate speech or aren't sure
- Student support of all types of speech is declining 78% in 2016,
 70% in 2017
- 51% of students agreed it was acceptable to disrupt controversial speakers' talks on campus, and 19% agreed violence was ok
- 61% of students felt campus climates prevent some people from expressing their views because others might find them offensive



Why Do We Need Campus Dialogues?

Higher education is experiencing increasing pressure to balance speech on campuses

 President Trump issued an executive order in March 2019 mandating that higher education institutions uphold free speech or risk losing grant funding

Higher education is spending huge amounts of money to maintain safety when controversial speakers come to campus

 In 2017, University of Florida spent \$500,000 on security to accommodate white nationalist Richard Spencer
