How to Become an **ESC Member Institution**

Eligibility

All institutions of higher education are invited to become ESC members if they have demonstrated a commitment to engaged scholarship, as evidenced by the Carnegie Foundation's Elective Classification in Community Engagement or by other evidence, as evaluated by the ESC Membership Committee.

- R2: Doctoral Universities High Research Activity (\$3,500)
- D/PU: Doctoral/Professional Universities (\$3,500)
