HEADQUARTERED: Camdenton, Missouri and primarily serves Camden, Dallas, Polk and Laclede counties in West Central Region and Texas, Webster and Wright in Southwest Region, with additional coverage as needed.

University of Missouri Extension regional specialists provide collaborative leadership and subject-matter expertise to develop, deliver and evaluate educational programs focused on improving lives, communities and economies. In general, regional specialists provide educational opportunities that enable businesses, farms, families and communities to strengthen the economy and enhance quality of life. In addition, regional specialists create partnerships with civic and business organizations, educational institutions, local leaders and key stakeholders to identify priorities, increase financial and in-kind resources, and strategically address needs with research-based education.

This position is responsible for planning, implementing and evaluating educational programs in the following subject-matter areas: community economic development, capacity assessment, community and organizational planning and decision making, regional development, leadership and civic engagement, community partnerships, local government, community emergency management, public policy issues identification and framing.

The Community Development program works collaboratively with communities to foster economic development, leadership development, community decision making, community emergency preparedness and inclusive communities. This is a 12-month academic position. Appointment may be made as non-tenure track ranked (NTT), depending on University approval of the academic credentials and qualifications of the successful candidate.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

 services.

- 3. Remain up-to-date on trends and research-based knowledge. Actively participate in professional development opportunities. Ensure core competencies are demonstrated. Regular travel in and out of state using own transportation is required. Work some evenings and weekends to meet the needs of learners and constituents.

Demonstrated ability in applying and transferring research-based knowledge in the above subject matter areas.

Ideal candidate will also have successful experiences in coalition and partnership building, community and organizational facilitation, community planning, non-profit management, community economic development, local government, community and economic data analysis, international development, leadership development and conflict resolution.

Completion of the Community Development Academy or Community Development Institute is helpful.

Experiences working with diverse audiences in a multicultural environment, and Spanish language proficiency is helpful.

Successful candidate will also demonstrate the following:

- Effective and innovative teaching strategies that engage others. Must be able to integrate new and emerging technology into teaching strategies.
- Effective listening, written and oral communication skills including public speaking and presentation abilities.
- Organizational skills, interpersonal skills, problem-solving abilities and collaborative leadership experiences. Flexibility, resiliency, and the ability to operate with minimal guidance.
- Positive outlook, high personal standard of excellence, and passion for the vision, mission and values of MU Extension.
