JMU's Institute for Innovation in Health and Human Services

Mission: IIHHS engages students in career preparation by promoting scholarship, providing interprofessional learning experiences, and connecting our campus with communities through innovative programs that advance quality of life.

Vision: We will be a nationally recognized model for university, student and community engagement dedicated to improving the human condition.

During 2014-2015, the Institute was able to:

- Provide \$6,210,480 in grant funded services to the citizens of Virginia, reaching every region of the Commonwealth with health and human service innovations.
- House 27 distinct community outreach or clinical service programs with collaborations involving 78 faculty members, representing 18 academic programs.
- Foster community engagement for 1,026 students, amplifying their studies from 40 undergraduate and graduate degree programs and achieving 44,290 hours of student participation in direct services and program support.
- Serve 23,436 clients in the community or in clinical encounters arranged at IIHHS.
- Enroll 774 students in workshops to advance cultural competency and 195 students in courses to promote interprofessional education.
- Launch JMU students into careers and graduate or professional studies with transformative experiential learning to polish their preparation.
